Notes for John Harty:

When John Harty came to Texas, he rode his horse all the way from Kentucky to Clarksville, Texas. John Harty immigrated to Texas with his father, Dennis Harty. Dennis Harty received the Mexican land grant of a league and a labor and John received a land grant adjoining his father's for 1/3 league or 1473 acres since John was a single man. These land grants are located just west of the Bowie County line in Red River County. He worked for two years as an overseer near Clarksville. Authorities came after John to enlist in the Mexican War. Not wanting to go, he chose an old, broken down horse which could not keep up with the others. A bad storm came up, they rode off and left him, so he returned home.

John had a wife and three children while in Red River County. Due to a terrible tragedy- a snake bit two of the children and while the mother was checking on them the baby fell in a wash tub and drowned- all in one day. The mother became despondent and soon died. John left Red River County, riding his horse to Cass County, to the village of Cusseta and built a two story log house. He traded that to Haney Floyd for 1400 acres of land that reached from John Russell's place to Dave Finley's place.

For the Civil War he paid a man name Jacobs \$15.00 a month and a horse and a saddle to go to war in his place. John was a saddler and made saddles for the Confederacy during the Civil War. He also made shoes and built coffins for people. After the death of his first family, John Harty rode off and left the land in Red River County. He settled in Cusseta in Cass County and built a two story log house which he later traded to Nelson H Haney and Killis S Floyd for 1400 acres of land. The land in Red River County was sold to Rebecca Titus in 1844.

John Harty's second wife was Julianna Haney, 1825-1876, from Tennessee, the daughter of "Major" Nelson H and Mary E Haney. Their seven children were born in Cusseta near Marietta in Cass County, Texas. Uncle Horace said he was the 1st jurors that met under a tree, after coming to Cass County.




John Harty married Julia Ann Haney. Their children were: Jane, Paralee, Augustus Rufus, Rebecca, Jennie, Dorothea, and Julie.

John married 2nd Martha Elizabeth Finley. They had: Ellen Cornelia, and John Henry.

WILKINSON COUNTY WILLS, 1817-1926, by Joseph T. Maddox, 1971, pp 112-113. It is quoted below:
WILL OF JOSEPH HANCOCK - GEORGIA, WILKINSON COUNTY I, Joseph Hancock, of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, but sick in body and knowing the uncertainty of death, make this my last will and testament. FIRST. I give my soul to God who gave it, and my body to its mother dust to be decently buried. ITEM 2. It is my request that my just debts be paid. ITEM 3. That my beloved wife, Mary Hancock, should have the balance of my property, both real and personal, after the payment of my just debts as before mentioned during her natural lifetime or widowhood. ITEM 4. It is my request that my sons: William Hancock, James Hancock, Edmund Hancock, Willis Hancock and John Hancock be and they are hereby appointed to contract and wind up my affairs and that my sons Willis, Edmund, John and daughter Elizar have the privilege to remain on my plantation, keep the property together and support their mother. ITEM 5. It is my request that after the death or marriage of my said wife, Mary, that then and all my property, both real and personal be equally divided among my children. ITEM 6. I wish that James Hatcher shall give my sons advice and instructions in relations to the manner of managing my property. This 8th day of _____, 1840, made in the presence of us. Joseph Hancock."

Notes for Dennis Harty:

Dennis Harty and Dorothy Dolly "Dorcas" Jobe were married in 1816 in Tennessee. They were living in Maury County, Tennessee in 1820 next door to Dennis's sister Jemima and her husband James Menasco. Dennis sold 1/2 of his land grant before his death. He sold 2338 acres to A J Titus in 1838 and 640 acres to John M Fleming and Lendell Davis in 1841 and that same year he sold 60 acres to B H Durham. The remainder of his grant was divided among his four children: John, Cynthia born 1823, Jonathan 1825-1863 married Mary Hancock, and Mary Ann married Andrew S Beard. Dennis and Dorcas Harty are probably buried near Avery, Texas where their land was located.

Notes for Hans Jacob Harty:

Three Harty brothers fought in the War of 1812. Dennis, Jacob and Daniel Harty enlisted in Andrew Jackson's army as volunteers from White County, Tennessee. They also fought in the Battle of New Orleans, but under the command of Andrew Jackson, representing America. Dennis and Daniel followed their father Jacob to Missouri in 1818 while family tradition insists that the third son, Jacob was never heard from again. He was married in Tennessee to a Miss Mourning Long, and it would be logical for him to have remained in Tennessee. His older brother, Dennis left his family in Missouri, and returned to Tennessee before leaving for TX

Source: Warren Co., Ga Will Book A, Pp 68-69 (ga Archives) Written: August 7 1802 In the name of God Amen. I Enoch Renfroe of the county of Warren and State of Georgia, planter, being weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul to God that gave it and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discession of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this Life I give demise & dispose of the Same in the following manner and form that is to Say First I give and Bequeath to Enoch Renfroe my beloved Son all that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Warren & sd state on waters of Joe's Creek containing one hundred and fifty acres, the same being the place whereon I now live and was originally granted to Stephen Mitchel by his Excelancy George Handley Governor dated 15th of August 1788 - and also I give and bequeath to my son Enoch Renfroe one other tract or parcel of land containing two hundred acres situate lying and being in above said state and county formerly Wilkes county on Joe's Creek adjoining the first above mentioned tract of land which tracts of two hundred acres being part of a tract of 775 acres granted to Samuel Camp the 22d day of January 1789 which said tracts or parcels of land together with all & Singular the premises and appurtinances thereon belonging or in any wise appurtaining to sd tracts or parcels of land unto my said son Enoch Renfroe his heirs & assigns then after my decease - Also I give my son Joel's Widow Sarah Renfroe five shillings - Also I give to her Daughter Nancy ten Dollars. Also I give & Bequeath to my beloved Children namely Mary Hancock, Stephen Renfroe, Nathaniel Renfroe's Widow Jane Baker, Margaret Renfroe five Dollars her portion (turn over) Sarah Rushin, John Renfro's Widow Martha Renfroe five Dollars to her and ten Dollars to her Daughter Nancy - Rachel Rushing, Lydia Chivers, William Renfroe, Nathan Renfroe, Enoch Renfroe, Martha Matthews likewise. I do appoint my son Enoch Renfroe and John Rushing Executors to this my last will and Testament for them to take the whole of all my property and sell it at public sale and Divide the money equally between these Eleven who have not a certain sum left them the other three which have a sum Left them are to have no more of my Estate after my decease wherefore I have Set my hand and fixed my Seal this Seventh day of August and in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and two and in the 27th of American Independance. In Witness Signed Sealed Published & declared by the Said Enoch Renfroe as his Last Will & Testament in the his presence of us who in the presence Enoch R Renfro (Seal) of Each other have hereunto Subscribed mark our names Vincent Davis William Simmons Elijah (X) Conner Additional Comments: Mary Renfroe, daughter of Enoch, married Clement Hancock, Sr. They moved to Wilkinson County, GA in 1810. Their sons Clement, Jr., John and William Hancock were living in Crawford Co., GA by the 1830 census. They and many of their descendants are buried in Crawford Co. and many more still live there.

Notes for Richard Pryor:

Richard Pryor is the earliest known ancestor of the Pryor families of the Jackson Purchase. He is first found in Albemarle County, Virginia where he is recorded as serving in the Albemarle militia guarding the western Virginia frontier during the French and Indian War in 1758.

The birth of a child, Richard, was recorded on the 11th of Dec 1763 in the Douglas Register of St. James Northam Parish, Goochland County to Richard Pryor and Mary Mooney. Mary obviously died shortly after the birth of the child for Richard and Mourning Thomson married circa 1765, probably in Louisa County, Virginia. Mourning is named as "Mourning Pryor" in the 1774 Louisa County will of her father, Thomas Thomson.

In 1780 Richard Pryor is reportedly on a list filed showing names of those building a road to Kentucky through the Cumberland Gap during the Revolution. He was recorded as serving on juries in Washington County, North Carolina in 1779 and again in 1782. Greene County, Tennessee was established out of Washington County by the North Carolina general assembly on 18 April 1783 and in 1783 Richard Pryor is listed in an Assessor's Return of the 4th District of Greene County. Richard is also recorded as an overseer of a road from Camp to Cove Creek that year.

On December 6th, 1787, Mourning "Prier" was one of the charter members of the Big Pigeon Primitive Baptist Church in Greene/Cocke Counties, Tennessee. In February of 1794, the church minutes record Mourning "Prier" as making application for dismissal which was presumably in preparation for the family's move to the Logan County, Kentucky area.

Richard Pryor was taxed for 200 acres on the Red River in Logan County in 1796, but was deceased before August 8, 1797 when Mourning was appointed administratrix of his estate. (Logan County Court Order Bk. A-1, p. 67)

The only document recording his heirs is an 1811 Logan County deed wherein ten heirs sold their portion of a tract of 250 acres in Logan County to Jonathan. The deed specifically states that the sellers are the heirs of Richard "Prior. It was common practice for legatees to sell their portions of an estate to one sibling but the problem with this deed is that it does not make an assertion that Jonathan was also an heir of Richard Prior.

On the 19th of June 1800, Mourning Pryor married Thomas White in Logan County, Kentucky and the following Smith County, Tennessee deed confirms that she was in fact the widow of Richard Pryor:

10 May 1802 - Smith Co., TN Deed Book 1801-17 p. 94

Between Thomas White and Mourning White, formerly Prior (Pryor) admx. of Richard Pryor, decd of Logan Co., KY and James Ewing of Smith Co., TN...During the lifetime of said Richard Pryor, he bound himself in the penal sum of 200 pounds to execute a deed to William Pryor for 400 acres of land, his choice of 1280 acres part of 3000 acres lying on the Caneyford of Cumberland River, Mourning White (formerly Pryor) widow of Richard obtained letters of Administration of said decedent and said William Pryor has sold to James Ewing his rights to 200 of the 400 acres of land etc.

Five years after Mourning married Thomas White, on September 28, 1805, Jonathan Pryor married his youngest daughter Elizabeth. When Thomas died in 1806, he named Mourning as the executrix of his estate in his will dated 18 Mar 1805. She is recorded, as Mourning White, in Logan County tax records after Thomas' death and in the 1810 census. Presumably she died sometime before 1820 for she is not found in that census. Trips to Logan County to search extensively for more information have failed to produce any further record of Mourning or a gravesite.

Notes for Andrew Jobe Jr.:

Tavern Keeper, Surveyor, Carpenter, Sheriff, Member of Assembly Born aboard ship between Kent, England and Portsmouth, New England (probably Rhode Island as Portsmouth, NH was not yet in existence) December 1682, The ship, "Welcome", arrived first in New Castle then Upland. It carried William Penn and a considerable number of Quakers. It can be assumed that Andrew Jobe and his brothers were there to greet them. In January Upland was renamed Chester in honor of the many settlers from Cheshire. 1683; Lord Baltimore claimed the most navigable part of the Delaware River for Maryland. William Penn asked his personal friend, Andrew Jobe, to help arbitrate, and, with much pomp ceremony, they met with Baltimore in May of 1683 in New Castle. Penn claimed his charter from Charles II gave him the right to the lower counties, but Baltimore claimed his charter from Charles I, which predated Penn's by 30 years, stated, "into that part of Delaware Bay on the north, which lies under the 40th degree of northern latitude." Finally Penn and his party prevailed, and a writer of the time Penned, "William Penn and Andrew Jobe being educated men, and being of such unusual persuasive and executive ability, convinced all concerned of the correctness of the boundary line." 1685; Thomas Vernon was named as peace maker. He and Andrew Jobe, Jr. agreed to the bad effects of selling whiskey to the Indians. They

Subscribed to the building of a Meeting House in Chester and collected subscriptions for Friends who were suffering in other parts of the colonies. They also subscribed to the 1st printing press in Penn. 1697-1701; Andrew Jobe was sheriff of Chester County and Clerk of the Chester Monthly Meeting 1699 Fall; William Penn arrived for the second time to find that Lord Baltimore in Maryland was still claiming a large tract of land in southern Pennsylvania. "William Penn, with his intimate friend Andrew Jobe, a man of education and influence, took a united stand in favor of the subject. Many Quaker leaders, who had been Penn's companions in England, sympathized with Penn and Job. Loaded with provisions and equipment, they proceeded on horseback to the disputed territory. Other than Penn and Jobe there was William Brown, James Brown, Ebenezer Empson, Cornelius Empson, Joel Baily, James Cooper, John Richardson, Edward Beeson, John Churchman, and Henry Reynold They found a beautifully rolling country that was moderately watered with small streams. They knew the soil was fertile for there was a dense growth of hickory, oak, and chestnut. Penn selected a spot for the Meeting House. The peace-loving Quakers decided upon a way to thwart Baltimore; they, themselves, would settle and survey the tract, which was named Nottingham." 1710; Andrew Jobe established the Blue Ball Tavern, a brick house at the junction of the Lancaster/ New Castle and Philadelphia/ Baltimore roads, on Lot #35 of the Nottingham Lots. The inn served travelers for more than 100 years. Although now a private dwelling, it still stands. A historical marker stands opposite. "As Andrew Jobe was well-educated and a personal friend and companion of William Penn, it would seem that he had returned to England for his education. There were no universities in the colonies except for Harvard, and it would have been impossible that a Quaker could attend Puritan Harvard during the seventeenth century. It must be noted that Andrew did not marry until the age of forty-two and that all of his children, except the last, had Biblical names. He was sixty years of age when Patience was born; it would seem that her name was a double joke. The will of ANDREW JOBE, JR. specified his wife as executrix. It provided land for the adult sons, the money with which to build houses, and pay for the keep of the workmen. He also provided for his minor children, and left money to his son-in-law and his four grandchildren. His signature was affixed to the will."

Notes for Elizabeth Vernon:

August 1682, The ship, "Friendship", with Robert Crossman, master, arrived from Liverpool; aboard was Thoms Vernon, wife, children (Elizabeth, future wife of Andrew Job would have been one of these children), brothers, and other extended family members. (After their arrival, Thomas was very prominent in the Quaker faith. His home was often used as a meeting place.. He served as a Juror in the 1st Chester County Court. His lands in Nether Providence on the west side of Providence Road, adjoined his brother's tracts. The area is now known as Rose Valley) Andrew Jobe and Elizabeth Vernon were married at the Chester Monthly Meeting. (Quakers married each other by the consent of and in the presence of Friends. They married after their own fashion, but without consent of the government, which considered the marriages illegal.)

Notes for Hans Jacobszen Hartje:

Hans Jacobsen Hartje, a weaver, was born in Berne, Switzerland, probably while his parents were traveling from Holland to America. Hans Jacobsen is Dutch for John, son of Jacob. Jacob often means James. Thus Hans was the son of Jacob Hartje and his mother was probably Frene, since his second natural daughter was Frene. He immigrated to New Amsterdam, known as New York today, around 1663. The Ship Passenger Lists-New York and New Jersey (1600-1825) edited by Carl Boyer, quotes, "'Deutsche Einzeleinwanderer und Familien in Neu-Niederland,' Jahr-buch Fur Auslandsdeutsche Sippenkunde, I (1936), 45-53 Lancour No. 73." which indicates that Hartje, Hans Jacobsen, Weber aus Bern in der Schweiz, or Hans Jacobsen Hartje was a weaver (Weber) and that he was born in Bern in Switzerland or (Schweiz). He came to America on board De Bonte Koe (The Spotted Cow) on April 16, 1663. His name was listed on the manifest as Hans Jacob Hartje. Hartje sounds like (Harding), hence the name Harding used by some early descendants. He bought a small farm in Stuyvesant's Bowery on 12 Feb 1669. Most of his children were born there and baptized in the local Dutch Reformed Church. He was married on 29 Jul 1668 in Bushwick, Kings, New York to Geertje, Gertrude (in English), Lambertse Mol. Geertje was the daughter of Lambert Huybertsen Mol and his wife Tryntje Pieterse Kouwenhoven. It should be noted that her mother's middle name, Pieterse, indicated that her father was Pieter or Peter Kouwenhoven. Geertje was christened on 6 Sep 1648 in the Bowery, New Amsterdam, Kings, New York. The "se" on the end of Peter indicated that she was the daughter of Peter. Her brother's middle names would have been "Pietersen" or son of Pieter which means Peter in English. (Many Dutch families named the first female baby after the mother's mother and the first male baby after the father's father. The second son was named after the mother's father and the second daughter was named after the father's mother. This, when linked with the practice of using the father's first name as a middle name for each child born to that father, made it possible to identify the lineage of families.)

Notes for Conradt Jacobsen Hartje:

In the early 1600's, the people of the Netherlands claimed the land along the Hudson River as New Netherlands. Henry Hudson was commissioned to seek out an all water route to the Indies. His exploration, in 1609, took him up a wide, deep beautiful river, which he named the Hudson. The people of the Netherlands were called "Dutch" by most other cultures. The Dutch bought land from the local indians, which they promptly renamed New Amsterdam. Careful comparison of Amsterdam to New Amsterdam would divulge many similarities, even the manner in which houses and windmills were located on the area surrounding the harbors. Eventually, the English decided to invade and take over the operation of the New Netherlands colony. This was completed in 1664. A timeline would reveal that New Netherlands existed from the early 1600's until 1664. A short time, but much was accomplished by the Dutch in this time period. The first schools of the new world were created in New Amsterdam. Separation of church and state, as a concept, surfaced because of the tolerant nature of the Dutch. Religious persecution did not exist in the Netherlands and was not permitted to exist in New Netherlands either. The people of New Netherlands were like their parents in the Netherlands, in that they had a decent, Christian, moral system which assisted immigrants by creating order, developing good work and private ethics, while creating fun, family activities which brought balance to the entire community. Some historians even suggest that the colors of the flag of the Netherlands, which was red-orange, white and blue served as a model for the red, white and blue that Americans grew to love. "Old Glory" may have used the colors of the Dutch flag, or maybe the colors of the Washington coat of arms were used to create it. In the final evaluation, only our ancestors know why they picked the colors and arrangement of our flag and nation, but one could assume that even they were not always aware why certain practices were started while others were not.
